JOB DESCRIPTION

Teacher of Chemistry

General

- To support the aims, values and ethos of the School and to contribute to the implementation of the School's Mission Statement

Key Responsibilities

- To support and encourage pupils to reach their full potential in Chemistry.
- To deliver stretching and inspiring lessons that facilitate progress for all pupils.
- To actively monitor pupil progress and to complete regular assessments and to complete reports.
- To undertake regular marking of pupils' work.
- To develop and share resources within the department, including schemes of work.
- To take opportunities to make cross-curricular links and contribute to event days.
- To contribute to the SMSC education of pupils and to foster understanding and respect of fundamental British values.
- To attend and contribute to department meetings.
- To share in responsibility for maintaining department noticeboards and displays.

Other Responsibilities

- Perform supervisory duties including invigilation; supervising pupils at breaks and covering for absent colleagues.
